# **U.S. Customs Compliance**

#### Overview

This awareness-level course provides users with an understanding of the rules and rationale behind numerous import-related issues – including classification, valuation, and country of origin – and their roles within the import process. The course introduces learners to free trade and other preferential agreements; duties, fees, and taxes; importer security filing; recordkeeping; and rules surrounding temporary imports. Function-based, real-world scenarios (both defense and commercial) illustrate how customs compliance affects a variety of activities in an organization and what actions must be taken to make sure the U.S. import requirements are satisfied.

#### **Target Audience**

This course is for employees throughout the organization, particularly those that may have responsibilities to provide information to the customs function. It is also for those in managerial roles needing to be aware of the reasons behind customs compliance inquiries and information requirements.

#### **Learning Objectives**

- Define key customs terms and topics.
- Expand the knowledge base of the corporation.
- Stress awareness to critical intersections between various corporate departments and the customs function.
